VISION FOR THE FUTURE OF OUR WORSHIP

One of the things that led me to apply for the job of incumbent of this parish was the vision outlined in the Parish Profile as I feel that I can, with your help, fulfil this.

We wish to appoint an incumbent who will:

- Inspire, motivate and lead people of all ages
- Offer effective pastoral care to all parishioners
- Facilitate both traditional and contemporary forms of worship
- Create and sustain a programme to involve young people in the Church
- Facilitate us in developing innovative ways of outreach to the community and especially young families

I was born and bred in a traditional Anglican background but have also experienced contemporary worship styles. I have ministered in Anglican Churches that are growing and flourishing whilst providing both traditional and contemporary styles of worship. This is my aim for our parish. Have a look at the six key parts of the Parish profile which come from the Parish development plan in the box above.

Vision for the future of our worship

It is the work of the church to spread the Good News of the love of Christ to all people in the parish. For most people church services are both the access points to joining the community of faith and the main vehicle for sustaining ones faith. They, therefore, need to be accessible, engaging and meaningful to a whole range of ages, tastes and backgrounds and so necessarily need to have a variety of worship styles. My lifetime experience in a number of Anglican churches is that worship needs to have variety and quality to attract a growing congregation. Anglican worship - imaginatively and flexibly exercised - can be a style of worship that attracts people from the whole range of denominational backgrounds and those with none.

It is my desire to see our parish have a service or some part of a service that everyone can relate to and enjoy every Sunday. It is vital that we grow numerically and especially that we attract young families to join and stay. Newcomers to church will return if they receive a warm welcome from established members and if they enjoy the worship. To this end and in discussion with others, I have implemented the following order of services which I hope will attract more young families at the same time as providing a good worship experience for those who like a traditional style of worship. There are six 5th Sundays a year. The first two Sundays in the month will have a service sheet to go along with the books so that people new to the church can follow the whole service easily. It is my aim to have every service last no longer than 1 hour with Sunday Club running on 2nd to 5th Sundays as usual.

The Promised Land Orphanage

A BIG THANK YOU to all those who donated so generously to my appeal back in June for items to give to the **Indian Christian Mission Centre, Salem, Tamil Nadu, India**. I was delighted at the response of the parish to my request for items to take out to the orphanage in India. Our parish donated just as much if not more than that of Belvoir Parish and we had so much clothing, stationery, gifts and miscellaneous things that we filled all our bags to the capacity permitted. ICMC had never seen so much donated!

Setting Up Shop

We had the opportunity to set up a “shop” at the smaller orphanage we visit (about 50 children) and helped the children find items to wear that they liked. They were delighted with this and it touches your heart to think they have so little that someone’s 2nd hand clothing is accepted with such joy.

At the main orphanage called “The Promised Land”, which looks after about 500 children aged between 4 and 18, the house parents and teachers and other staff give out the items of clothing, gifts and books over the coming months as and when required and also to the most needy. When a new person comes they arrive often with only the worn clothing they are wearing, so it is wonderful that they can be given a new outfit. The stationery items were also much appreciated, especially by the teachers.

Last night's washing will have to come down off the line!


I've been meaning to clean the bathroom floor too

Prayers for Healing on Wednesday Mornings

I have begun to use consecrated oil for praying for healing on Wednesday mornings at the Holy Communion service and also when on pastoral visits if the person is happy to receive this ministry. I simply anoint the palm of the person's hand and pray a prayer from the prayer book asking the Lord to bring peace and healing. After all is said and discussed we know not why some people are healed and some are not. Our task is to approach the throne of Grace as little children and simply pray for God's presence, peace, blessing and healing to be upon a person and then leave it up to the Lord. "Consecrated" means that an everyday object has been set aside for holy use. Oil is a symbol of the blessing of the Lord. Psalm 23:5: "You anoint my head with oil" Oil was used on sheep to bring physical healing and so to continue the symbolism we use it on each other in prayer to bring God's blessing - his healing and peaceful presence. If you would like me to call round and pray with you just let me know.

Parish Finance Update



Rev. Jeremy's appointment has brought opportunities for growth within our Parish, but this comes at a financial cost as his salary and pension are paid entirely by us without any contribution from the Diocese, wider church or elsewhere. We can currently manage to meet those costs but the Rector and Select Vestry would also like to expand our mission to the community. This will bring additional expense and I would encourage Parishioners to keep supporting the United Parish as we look to the future. I would also like to thank all those who have contributed to date – your generosity is very much appreciated.

General Account (for day to day income and expenditure)

At the end of September this account had a surplus of £15,562. This is £2,500 down on 4 months ago, but remains very healthy. We need to generate income of over £5,000 per month to continue to run the Parish and costs continue to rise. We continue to incur expenses on jobs which in the past have been done by parishioners on a voluntary basis, a practice made more difficult by our increasingly busy lives. I would encourage us all to bear this in mind in our giving, both financial and in kind.

Fabric Account (for major works on property and buildings)

At the end of September this account also showed a surplus of £4,025 after significant expenditure on the redecoration of the Parish hall, a much needed project which will benefit the whole community. In addition we are again looking at major works at St John's which have been on hold during the vacancy. Please contact either myself or Isobel McCollam if you wish to set up a bankers order for this fund and a big **“thank you”** to those parishioners who have done so over the summer.
